Nurse Practitioner (Rockyview Hospital)

This position provides support to postpartum patients of both the Calgary West Central and South Calgary Primary Care Networks at the Rockyview Hospital. The NP demonstrates leadership skills and is responsible and accountable for the provision of evidenced-based Maternal and Infant or Newborn Care. This is a part-time position equivalent to 28 hours per week, with a possibility for augmentation of hours dependent on hospital demand and needs.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Performs and documents comprehensive assessments, diagnosis (including the ordering and interpretation of tests), interventions, management, referral and evaluation of client care.
- Develops, implements and evaluates care plans with the Primary Care physician and team.
- Provides care consultation, clinical demonstration, case review and bedside and teaching rounds.
- Directs patient discharge plans and liaises with the health care team to communicate pertinent information and facilitate follow-up care and treatment.
- Supports evaluation and research both on practice and patient care, and recommends changes in clinical practice as necessary.

Qualifications:

- A Masters of Nursing and Nurse Practitioner Certification is required. Expertise in Maternal and Infant or Newborn Care is required.
- Minimum 5 years experience, in high risk obstetrics in an acute care setting. Minimum 3 to 5 years as a Nurse Practitioner in Women's Health required; previous experience in a similar practice setting preferred.
- Demonstrated clinical skills in obstetrical nursing, with evidence of own continued professional development.
- Knowledge of and ability to use electronic medical records. Knowledge of Sunrise Clinical Manager is considered an asset.
- Team player and client focused, with strong interpersonal and communication skills; able to work collaboratively with all healthcare team members in a matrix structure.
